I am also winner of Swiss Excellence Scholarship 2014-2015. Currently, I teaching at the Department of Sociology, Quaid-i-Azam University Islamabad. I am author of two books: Exchange Marriages in South Punjab, Pakistan: A Sociological Analysis of Kinship Structure, Agency, and Symbolic Culture and Youth Politics in Pakistan: Civic Engagement and Opportunity Structure (in press). Beside this, I published 30 research articles in international peer review journals (including impact factor journal).
